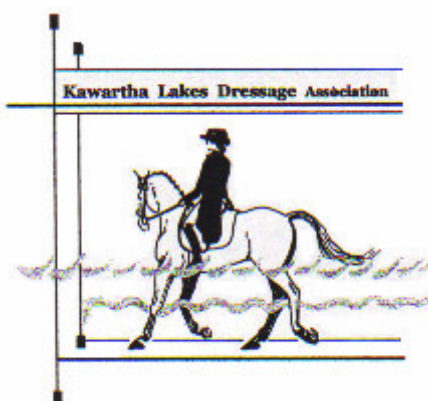

The Dressage Championships and National Show listed herein is a sanctioned Class 8 competition member of Equine Canada (EC), 2685 Queensview Drive, Suite 100, OTTAWA, ON, K2B 8K2, and are governed by the rules of the Federation. Knowledge of EC rules is the responsibility of each competitor.

Equine Canada Statement of Principle

Equine Canada (EC), the National Equestrian Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
- Requiring owner, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition practices, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT RULES OF EC AND WILL BE HELD AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE EC RULE BOOK.

CHAMPIONSHIP DIVISIONS

Championship and Reserve Championships will be awarded for the Divisions listed below. Riders competing in Training, First and Second level classes will ride tests 3 & 4. Riders competing in Third and Fourth level classes will ride tests 2 & 3. Two technical tests are ridden for each Division. The rider with the highest combined score, from the two tests, will be declared Champion. The rider with the second highest combined score will be declared Reserve Champion. Refer to 2007 Rules of Equine Canada, Section E, Art 2.6 g. Horse and rider combinations may enter two consecutive levels.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRIES – Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by:

1. A copy of a current 2007 Coggins Test
2. Copies of 2007 EC membership cards for Rider & Owner
3. Copies of 2007 Provincial membership cards for Rider & Owner
4. Copy of 2007 Horse License Sticker (make a copy of passport)
5. Your stabling form
6. Your signed waiver (parent or guardian must also sign for junior riders)
7. Your accurate and complete entry form
8. Your cheque, made payable to **Kawartha Lakes Dressage Assoc.**

Post-dated cheques will not be accepted. Entries must be received by the Show Secretary, Lisa Hossack-Scott, 2833 Hwy #28, RR#1, Douro, Ont K0L 1S0, by August 27, 2007. Faxed entries are subject to a \$20.00 service charge and must have a visa/mastercard number provided for processing to that credit card. Incomplete entries are subject to a \$10.00 service charge. Late entries are subject to a \$30.00 late fee, and will only be accepted at the discretion of the Show Committee. Any cheques returned by the bank, for any reason are subject to a \$30.00 fee.

QUALIFYING SCORES - Those wishing to compete at the Ontario Dressage Championships are required to forward qualifying scores for the level in which they intend to compete. They must be two posted scores from two different judges officiating at two different national dressage competitions with a minimum of 55% (ALL TRAINING THROUGH FOURTH LEVELS). In the case of Pony, Junior, Young Rider, Advanced and Grand Prix Divisions, one score

(minimum 55%) at each of the relevant classes must be submitted. In the case of freestyles, please refer to the 2007 Rules of Equine Canada, Section E (Dressage), 2.3.d. All scores must be obtained since September 16, 2006. Scores from Championship classes at the 2006 Ontario Dressage Championships will not count. Classes will be filled in descending order by averaging the scores submitted.

CLOSING DATE – The closing date for entries is **August 27, 2007**.

CATEGORIES – Those wishing to compete in two categories (i.e. AA and Open) will pay two entry fees, but may ride one test; the score will count for both categories. If there are fewer than six (6) entries per category at any level the organizing committee has the option of holding only the open category.

CANCELLATIONS – Cancellations will only be accepted upon receipt of a Veterinarian/Doctor's Certificate. Refunds of 100% of entry and stabling fees, less administration fee, will be allowed up until the closing date (August 27, 2007). Refunds of 50% of entry fees, less administration fee, will be made after the closing date and before the start of the show. There will be no refunds on stabling fees after the closing date. Cancellations after the show starts will lose the total entry and stabling fee.

CHANGES TO ENTRIES – Changes to accepted entries requested after the closing date will be subject to a \$10 Entry Change Fee per change of test or division. This fee may be waived at the discretion of the organizing committee.

PASSPORTS – All entries must have a passport and a valid EC horse licence to compete. For all horses (including non-showing horses), competitors must submit a passport before receiving a number.

NUMBERS – All competitors and non showing horses must wear a number at all times in the schooling and exercise areas and in the competition rings. Passports will be returned upon return of number. A fee of \$20.00 will be charged for any lost or damaged numbers.

RIDING TIMES – Riding times will be available at www.klda.ca by Monday September 10th, 2007. Ride times will also be available by telephoning the Show Secretary (705) 749 9726, on Monday, September 10th, 2007 between 1pm and 10 pm.

PARKING – Vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. There is no parking on the roads and the barn areas at any time. After unloading, please do not park in the stable area.

PRESENTATIONS – There will be formal presentations for the Ontario Championships, dressed and mounted. Competitors will be advised over the P.A. system.

DOGS – No dogs allowed on property at the request of the facility owners.

QUERIES – Questions concerning rules, scoring or entries may be made to the Steward for discussion with the Organizing Committee. Protests must be made in writing within 48 hours of the completion of the class and accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00, cash or certified cheque. See EC Rules.

SECURITY – Security will not be provided. The show organizers and the facility accept no responsibility for lost or stolen items. Please do not leave items unattended.

WHIPS – MUST NOT BE CARRIED IN ANY CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS

TESTS – MUST NOT BE CALLED IN ANY CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS

RING SIZE – ALL CLASSES WILL BE HELD IN THE 20 X 60 RING

TACK CHECK AFTER TEST – It is the rider's responsibility to report to the Steward immediately after the test and before dismounting. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

DRUG TESTING – EC/FEI Drug and Medications rules apply at these Championships. Any horse entered in any class at any competition subject to the requirement to pay drug-testing fees may, while on the competition grounds and on the recommendation of the chair of the provincial Equine Medications Control committee or the chair's appointee, be selected for equine medication control testing.

STABLING – The cost per stall is \$160.00 for the duration of the competition, Friday through Sunday. Stalls will not be bedded, please bring your own shavings or shavings will be available at \$7.00 per bag. Please bring your own hay, feed and buckets. Day stalls are not available. Thursday night arrival by special request, \$25.00 extra.

INSURANCE – All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. Third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events is necessary.

NON-SHOWING HORSES - There is a \$75.00 fee for non-showing horses. Non-showing horses are subject to all the rules pertaining to showing horses. This includes submitting a passport to obtain a number, which must be worn at all times.

Ontario Championship DIVISION RIBBONS – Ribbons will be presented to 8th place. Championship & Reserve Championship ribbons will be presented.

NON-championship DIVISION RIBBONS – Ribbons will be presented to 6th place.

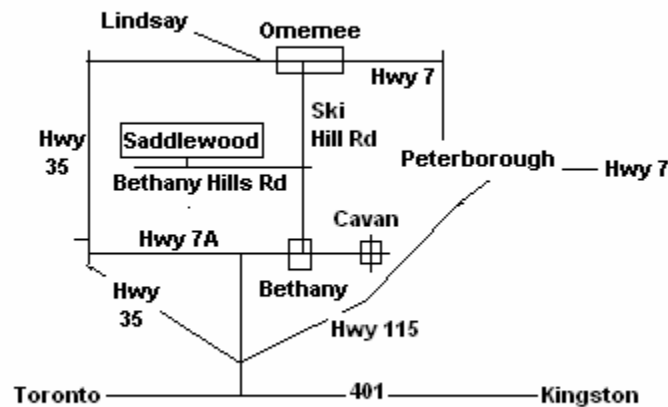
Warm up will be available as posted. Please ensure that you wear your competition number at all times.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY.**

Every entry at a KAWARTHA LAKES DRESSAGE ASSOCIATION (KLDA) event shall constitute an agreement that the person making it; owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, and the horse shall be subject to the Constitution and the Rules of Equine Canada, the local rules of KLDA and the facility, and that the owner and/or participant and any of their representatives are bound by the Constitution and the Rules of Equine Canada, KLDA and the facility; accept as final the decision of the Hearing committee on any questions arising under said rules and agree to hold KLDA, the facility, E.C., their officials, directors and employees harmless for any action taken.

I do hereby certify that every horse, rider and/or driver is eligible as entered and agree for myself and my representatives to be bound by the Constitution and Rules of Equine Canada. It is hereby recognized that all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. I hereby accept this risk and hold harmless the E.C., KLDA, the facility, their officials, the competition organizers, agents, employees and their representatives.

I acknowledge that any activity involving horses is high risk including but not limited to:

- (a) the propensity of any equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm or death to persons on or around them and to potentially collide with, bite or kick other animals, people or objects;
- (b) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, tremors, vibrations, unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals and hazards such as subsurface objects;
- (c) the potential for other participants to behave in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to themselves or others, including failing to act within their abilities to maintain control over an equine

In addition to consideration given for my Participation in this KLDA event being held at Saddlewood Equestrian Centre, in September 2007, I and my heirs, executors, administrations and assigns agree;

- **To Waive ALL Claims that I might have against the** Organizing Committee, KLDA, as well as their directors, officers, agents, representatives, employees, officials, members, volunteers and the owners or occupier of the land upon which the event is held (all of them collectively hereinafter referred to as the "HOST"); and
- **To Release the "HOST" from Any and All Liability** for any loss, damages, injury, or expense that I or my "Legal Representatives" might suffer as a result of my Participation due to any cause whatsoever **including any NEGLIGENCE ON THE PART OF THE "HOST"**; and
