EQUINE CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with the kindness, respect and compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors (or their agents) use responsible care in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuing well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with healthcare professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organizations' rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person (informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures) would be determined to be neither cruel, neither abusive, nor inhuman.

Silver Dressage Championship – Rules, Conditions and Regulations

1. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC. Competitors are responsible for knowledge of these rules.
2. The show committee reserves the right to govern all conditions of the show.
3. Judges' and stewards' decisions are final.
4. A photocopy of a current year OEF Membership and EC Competitive License for both owner and rider must be submitted with each entry.
5. A copy of the current year negative Coggins test for each horse being exhibited must be submitted with each entry.
6. A copy of the inside cover of the current year passport for the horse being exhibited showing the current year horse license sticker must be submitted with each entry.
7. A copy of the cover page of the tests indicating the qualifying scores and show attendance must be submitted with each entry. (See Qualifying Criteria/Eligibility section for requirements.)
8. Entries must be received by the applicable closing date with all required information, appropriate signatures, photocopies of memberships, Coggins tests and qualifying test scores, and payment in full in order to be accepted. Faxed entries will not be accepted since payment must accompany entry.
9. Cheques are to be made out to "OADG" for the Eastern Division and to "Blue Star Farm" for the Western Division.
10. Post-dated cheques (after the closing date[s]) will not be accepted. Competitors will be charged \$25.00 for any cheque returned for any reason from the bank.
11. Refunds will be made in full, less the administration fee, up to the closing date. After the closing date 50% of the class/division fees will be refunded if the following criteria are met.
 - The Show Secretary must be notified no later than one day prior to the show.
 - The Show Secretary must receive a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate within 10 days after the show.
12. In the case where qualifying scores are required from competitions held after the closing date, entries must still be submitted by the closing date. Should qualifying scores not be achieved, 100% of all fees, minus the administration fee, will be refunded.
13. Competitors may enter either the Eastern or the Western Division, but not both.
14. All levels will be offered as categories (except where indicated) of Open, Junior and Amateur. However, the organizing committees reserve the option to hold only an Open category if there are fewer than six (6) entries per category.
15. Riders wishing to **compete in two categories** of a level will pay an extra fee of \$50 for their second category, **but will ride in only one category**. That is, the competitor will ride the test for their level in their declared category of Junior or Amateur. That score will also count for the Open category, referred to as their **Add-On** category.
16. In the event that class sizes must be limited, classes will be filled in descending order of the average of the qualifying scores submitted.
17. Horse/Rider combinations may compete at two consecutive levels but in only one freestyle

level.

18. All freestyle entries must present an appropriately marked CD or cassette tape to the secretary with the passport. All compact discs must be R only since RW will not play in some systems. Please confirm playability in a regular CD player. Cassette tapes must be rewound and ready to start. In accordance with EC rule E317A, two functioning copies of music must be submitted.
19. All tests will be ridden in the 20x60 ring.
20. This is a **Championship**. Refer to the current year Rules of Equine Canada. Sections 7.24 through 7.30 relate to CHAMPIONSHIP competitions ONLY. Of special note (but not inclusive of all rules in effect): **No tests may be called.**
21. Non-competing horses are not allowed on the show grounds.
22. Any horse on the show grounds is subject to random drug testing. Failure to comply will result in elimination from competition and disciplinary action from EC.
23. Stabling is to be arranged as per each division's instructions.
24. Neither OADG, Cadora-Ontario, the show committees, Spiritwood Farm, nor Blue Star Farm (the facilities) will be held responsible for any damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property, of exhibitors or spectators. A signed liability waiver form must accompany every entry.
25. Passports with a valid current year EC horse license sticker must be presented to the show secretary in order to be issued a competition number.
26. Passports will be returned with the return of the numbers.
27. Competition numbers must be worn at all times that the horse is out of its stall or trailer.
28. Juniors must wear approved headgear (as per current EC regulations). Top hats are prohibited for juniors.
29. Approved headgear must be worn at all times when mounted, with the exception of top hats, which may be worn only in the competition ring (adults only).
30. No one other than the competing rider may school the horse from the moment it arrives on the show grounds to the end of the last class ridden.
31. From the moment the horse arrives on the show grounds, all EC rules and regulations apply.

Silver Dressage Championships - Qualifying Criteria/Eligibility

1. To qualify for the Silver Dressage Championships, a **horse/rider combination** must have competed in a minimum of two Silver competitions and earned two scores of 55% or higher (including freestyles) at different competitions (from the same or different judges) at each level (including FEI) to be entered. Proof, in the form of photocopies of the completed test cover pages, must be submitted with each entry. The cover page will indicate date, show, level, score and judge's signature.
2. In the event that there are insufficient entries received, additional entries will be accepted (first come, first served) provided the horse/rider combination has competed in two Silver competitions at each level to be entered and has attained scores 50% or above.
3. Horses may compete with two different riders at two different levels if each horse/rider combination has qualified.
4. No substitute riders are allowed unless the substitute rider is also qualified on the horse.
5. Competitors may not enter a freestyle without having competed in the appropriate technical tests.

Silver Dressage Championships - Awards

1. Note: This is a Championship. Refer to the current year Rules of Equine Canada. Sections 7.24 through 7.30 relate to CHAMPIONSHIP competitions ONLY.
2. Should there be two judges for a class, the class score shall be deemed to be the average of the two scores obtained from the judges.
3. Class ribbons will be awarded to 8th place. As per EC rules, any horse receiving less than 50% on a technical test will not be eligible for any class awards. When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded as follows: 1st 60% or higher, 2nd 57% to 59.9%, 3rd 54% to 56.9%, and 4th 51% to 53.9%. No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 4th position.
4. Championships will be awarded at each level (Walk/Trot through Advanced) in Open, Junior and Amateur (except where indicated). Championships are determined by the total percentage of the two technical tests. The competitor with the highest total shall be declared the champion of his/her level and category (e.g.: Training Level, Junior, etc.) and the competitor with the second highest total shall be declared the reserve champion.
5. Freestyle Championships will be awarded at each level (Training through Intermediaire 2) as an Open division only. Championships are determined by the total percentage of the freestyle test and the higher percentage of the technical test(s) from the same level.
6. Ribbon and award presentations may be mounted out of respect for sponsors. Horse and rider must be dressed appropriately for presentations. Competitive numbers must be visible. For unmounted presentations, rider must be dressed appropriately. Non-compliance may result in forfeiture of any and all ribbons, awards and prizes for the class. Presentation details will be posted on the day of the show.

THE SILVER DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIPS TEAM COMPETITION

Cadora-Ontario is pleased to announce that the 2010 Silver Dressage Championships will host, once again, a **TEAM COMPETITION**. With a view to encouraging more participation in the Championships, those Cadora-Ontario members who compete as individuals at either Division of this year's Silver Dressage Championships are invited to form "teams" and compete together for ribbons, product prizes (contingent upon the acquisition of same) and prize money.

Rules governing this Team Competition are as follows:

1. It is recommended that each team identify itself when making entries for the Silver Dressage Championships; however, teams can also be formed and identified AT the Championships, before the competition begins.
2. **NEW FOR 2010!!** Each team will consist of three horse/rider combinations.
3. The higher individual technical score of each of the three team members will be added together to determine team placings.
4. Riders competing as team members must also compete in their relevant technical classes.
5. Freestyles are not part of the Team Competition.
6. **All riders of all teams must be members of Cadora-Ontario.**
7. There is no limit to the number of teams that can be fielded by any one Cadora group and/or Cadora-Ontario members and/or at either Division.
8. Two (or more) Cadora groups or Cadora-Ontario members can go together to form a team.
9. Ribbons will be awarded to all members of those teams that finish 1st, 2nd and 3rd, East and West.
10. **NEW FOR 2010!!** Prize money (\$100.00) will be awarded to each member of the first place teams, East and West, provided there are at least three competing teams in the division whereat said prize money is to be won; said prize money (and ribbons) will be presented at the next Cadora-Ontario Annual General Meeting (2011).
11. Additional prizes may be awarded pursuant to the acquisition of same.
12. All riders of the first place teams, East and West, will be listed on the Cadora-Ontario Roster of Riders with their team name.
13. All teams entered **MUST** provide a team name (e.g. Glanbrook Gators).
14. **NO** additional entry fees are required to enter teams.
15. Any changes to a team (once identified) must be communicated to the respective Divisional Show Secretary ASAP (before competition commences)

1	I am the parent and/or legal guardian of the minor child named above and am executing this form on behalf of the minor child in my capacity of parent/guardian and with the intent that this form is binding on myself and the minor child for all legal purposes.
2	I confirm that, in the event the above minor child is participating in an EC-sanctioned competition where approved headgear is required for a junior, he/she will wear a properly fitted helmet meeting or exceeding EC Art G102 standards (ATSM/BSI approved) with safety harness correctly fastened at all times when mounted. I understand that he/she will not be allowed to compete if this requirement is not met.
3	I understand that there are inherent DANGERS, HAZARDS, AND RISKS (collectively called "risks") associated with equine activities, and that injuries resulting from these are a common occurrence.
4	I acknowledge that the inherent risks of equine activities mean those dangerous conditions which are an integral part of equine activities, including, but not limited to: - the propensity of any equine to behave in ways that might result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them, and to potentially collide with, kick or bite other animals, people, or objects. - the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movements, tremors, vibrations, unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals and hazards such as subsurface objects;
5	I freely accept and fully assume all responsibility for the inherent risks and the possibility of personal injury, death, property damage or loss which might result from my own/minor child's participation.
6	I acknowledge that it remains my sole responsibility to act in such a manner as to be responsible for my own/ minor child's safety and to participate within my own/minor child's own limits.
7	In addition for the consideration given for my/my minor child's participation in equine activities, I and my heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns (collectively called my "legal representatives") agree: - to waive all claims that I might have against the HOST , - to release the HOST from any and all liability for any loss, damages, injury, or expense that I/my minor child or legal representatives might suffer as a result of my own/minor child's participation due to any cause, including any negligence on the part of the HOST ; - to hold harmless and indemnify the HOST from any and all liability for property damages or personal injury to myself/minor Child or to any third party which might result from my own/minor child's participation.
